PRACTICE OF THE PROFESSION AWARD (The Parke O. Davidson Award)

Purpose of Award:

To recognize significant and distinguished contributions to the practice of the profession of psychology in British Columbia.

Requirements of Nominee:

A psychologist registered in British Columbia who:

- Conducts research
- Publishes
- Develops technology for use by professionals with applications to practice
- Is instrumental in the development of direct services to the public
- Conducts advocacy regarding psychological impacts

HUMANITARIAN EFFORTS COMMENDATION

Purpose of Award:

To acknowledge a psychologist who provides inspiration through his/her humanitarian work, and professional or volunteer efforts.

Requirements of Nominee:

A psychologist registered in British Columbia who:

- Has special qualities of character and skills
- Demonstrates an unselfish long-term commitment to the dignity and empowerment of individuals or groups

Who can nominate? Psychologists registered in British Columbia

EXCELLENCE IN TEACHING AWARD (The Donald Sampson Award)

Purpose of Award:

To recognize individual psychologists or teams of psychologists who have made significant and distinguished contributions to the teaching of the discipline of psychology.

Requirements of Nominee:

A psychologist registered in British Columbia who:

- Has/have taught in one of the following settings: Institutional, Clinical, Distance Education, Workshop or Conferences
- Has/have developed one or more of the following: Curriculum, Training Method or Multi-media Training
- Has/have demonstrated unique and effective teaching approaches

Who can nominate? Psychologists registered in British Columbia, Students or members of the public

ADVANCEMENT OF THE PROFESSION AWARD (The Elizabeth Huntsman Award)

Purpose of Award:

To recognize significant and distinguished contributions to the advancement of the profession of psychology.

Requirements of Nominee:

A psychologist registered in British Columbia who:

- Has increased the visibility and/or viability of the profession of psychology
- Is a strong advocate or model for the professional identity or practice of psychology
- Manages, organizes, or promotes the provision of psychological services in an exemplary way
- Through their advocacy for the profession, significantly improves the ability of individual psychologists to practice their profession
